Heart Words & Multisensory Fun (K-2)

This workshop will discuss the purpose and importance of teaching heart words. During our workshop, caregivers will learn how to assist their students in improving their skills and abilities in literacy. Join to learn more about what multisensory instruction is and leave with fun multisensory activities you can do at home!

Empowering Math Minds: A Parent's Guide to Supporting Your Child at Home (3-5)

It will focus on four essential mathematical operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Teaching Syllable Types and Syllabication to Improve Reading and Spelling (2-5)

Has your child ever been intimidated by reading a long word? This presentation will provide families with multisensory strategies on how to break a word into syllables. Families will gain knowledge of the six syllable types and the five patterns to break apart words. Families will be provided with activities and games they can take home.

The Road to Reading: Playing With Words (K-2)

This session will provide families with strategies to help children hear, identify, and manipulate sounds in oral language. This skill is a strong predictor of reading success and is an important component of foundational reading skills. Families will be provided with activities, games, and "ear exercises" to play with their child. Let's have fun with words!



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How to Build an At-Home Library (K-5)

The more reading materials that children are exposed to, the more likely they are to take an interest in reading. By creating an at-home library, parents can expand on a child's reading interests and incorporate materials to help build literacy skills including but not limited to phonological awareness, fluency, and comprehension.
